Why focus on underage alcohol and tobacco use?

Research provides more reasons than ever for parents and other adults to be alarmed about the effects of underage drinking and tobacco use on Texas children. Among Texas youth, alcohol is the primary drug of choice – nearly double the use of other substances. Tobacco continues to be second. Both are gateways to other drug use and risky behaviors, linked to truancy and low test scores. Now is the time to learn about proven steps for community action to prevent and reduce youth access and availability to these substances.

What is a Community Regional Forum?

Regional Forums are opportunities for communities to equip themselves with needed information and tools to effectively collaborate for change at local, regional and state levels.

Texans Standing Tall partners with community coalitions and organizations across the state to hold Regional Forums. The Community Forums focus on preventing youth alcohol and tobacco use with the ultimate goal of reducing all youth substance abuse.
